## **1. Admission Policy**

Hiroshima City University aims to foster human resources who have rich sensibilities and creativity, who possess enthusiasm for seeking truth, who respect a diversity of cultures and values, and who aspire to create a world of peace. We also devote our efforts to develop those who are equipped with the capability to broadly contribute to society, utilizing a broad range of general knowledge, advanced and specialized knowledge, and a high level of ethics.

To this end, the following persons are welcome to enroll in our university.

- Individuals who have a rich sense of humanity, and who have a strong desire for learning
- Individuals who have high academic interests and a deep intellectual curiosity, and who aspire to create and utilize new knowledge.
- Individuals who desire to contribute actively to building world peace and promoting local and international community development.

Ideal candidates for this program are:

- Individuals who have a broad education and keen interest in various regional and global issues.
- Individuals who have the skills of reading, thinking, and expressing themselves at the level required for attending graduate school.
- Individuals who have basic knowledge in research categories of the Graduate School of International Studies and who desire to enhance their specialized knowledge and research capabilities.

## 2. Degrees Conferred

The master degree program confers "Master of Arts," "Master of Arts in International Studies," or "Master of Arts in Peace Studies," depending on the content of the master thesis of each student and the courses he or she has taken.

## 4. Application Qualifications

#### (1) Entrance Examination

Applicants must satisfy any of the following qualifications.

- 1) A person who has graduated or is expected to graduate from a university accredited under the School Education Act (Act No. 26 of 1947) by September 30, 2017.
- 2) A person who has been awarded or is expected to be awarded by September 30, 2017 a bachelor's degree in accordance with the provisions of Article No. 104-4 of the School Education Act.
- 3) A person who has completed or is expected to complete by September 30, 2017 16 years of regular curricular studies abroad.
- 4) A person who has completed or is expected to complete by September 30, 2017 16 years of regular curricular studies in a distance-learning program of an overseas educational institution offered in Japan.
- 5) A person who has completed or is expected to complete by September 30, 2017 a course at an overseas higher educational institution in Japan (limited to those who have completed a 16-year course of education in overseas schools) that is assessed to be an educational facility within that country's education system and has been specifically designated by the Japanese Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology (MEXT).
- 6) A person who has completed on or after the date specified by MEXT or is expected to complete by September 30, 2017 an educational program of a technical or vocational school specified by MEXT (more than 4 years education and fulfilling other criteria set by MEXT).
- 7) A person who is selected by MEXT.
- 8) A person who has been enrolled over 3 years in a university or who has completed or is expected to complete 15 years of regular education in countries other than Japan, with excellent academic grades recognized by Hiroshima City University's Graduate School.
- 9) A person who is recognized, through a specific entrance examination by Hiroshima City University's Graduate School, as someone with abilities equivalent to those who have graduated from a university, and has reached 22 years of age as of October 1, 2017.
- 10) A person who is recognized by Hiroshima City University's Graduate School as someone who has abilities equivalent to those who have graduated from a university.

#### Notes:

- 1. Qualification 2 above covers persons who have been awarded or are expected to be awarded a bachelor's degree from the National Institution for Academic Degrees and University Evaluation.
- 2. Persons admitted to the Graduate School under qualification 8 above need to leave the university in which they are currently enrolled. This means they will not be able to receive a bachelor's degree from their current university and, as a result, may lose their eligibility for admission to various kinds of national examinations.
- 3. Qualification 9 above refers to those who do not have a bachelor's degree. This includes those who have graduated from a junior college, technical college, vocational school or various other schools.

## (2) Entrance Examination designed for the full-fledged

Applicants are required to satisfy any of the above-mentioned qualifications 1 to 7 and 9 and have at least three years of work experience in the public or private sector, or at least three years of other experience (as a homemaker, volunteer, etc.) at the time of enrollment.

## [Long-term Study System]

The standard time to complete a Master's Degree Program is two years. However, those who have difficulty completing study programs in the standard time period can apply for the Long-term Study System after enrollment. This system enables students to extend their period of study to three or four years to acquire the necessary credits and complete their master thesis in order to receive their master degree. Tuition for students who have been deemed eligible for long-term study shall remain the same. The total tuition amount for the standard term of study shall be divided by the total number of years in the extended period of study. The resulting amount shall be paid during each academic year.

The use of the Long-term Study System shall be limited to students admitted through the entrance examination designed for the full-fledged.

#### (3) Preliminary Screening for Qualifications of Applicants

Applicants who qualify for admission **under qualifications 8, 9 or 10** are required to contact the Admissions Office of Hiroshima City University and submit the following documents for preliminary screening. If you submit the required documents by mail, please be sure to write in red "**Preliminary Screening Application Documents**, **Master's Program, Graduate School of International Studies**" on the envelope and send it by **registered express mail**. For the mailing address, refer to "(5) **Application Submission Address and Inquiries Regarding Applications and Examinations" in "5. Application Procedures."** 

Screening results will be sent to applicants prior to the application period.

  - A summary of major research achievements to date must be prepared on A4-size paper: about 2,000 to 2,400 characters in Japanese, or two pages (double-spaced, 80 characters x 29 lines) in English.

e) A photocopy of the certificate for qualification acquired after the last school attended

## 5. Application Procedures

#### (1) Prior Consultation

Prior to your application, you must contact the Admissions Office to seek prior consultation with a faculty member you wish to work with. Please refer to the List of Faculty Members (pages 12 to 14) or our website.

#### (2) Application Period

#### June 19 (Mon) to 23 (Fri), 2017

Note: Application documents must be submitted by 5:00 p.m. on the closing day.

If your application document is sent by registered express mail, it must be postmarked on or before June 22 (Thu), 2017.

#### (3) Application Method

After consultation with a faculty member you wish to work with, please enclose all application documents in an envelope that accommodates A4-size documents and submit it in person or by mail to the Admissions Office by the deadline. If submitting by mail, be sure to write in red "Application Documents for Graduate Program Enclosed" on the envelope and send it by registered express mail.

If submitting in person, application documents are accepted from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on weekdays.

#### (4) Choosing between "Master Thesis" and "Research Paper"

Master program students are usually required to write a thesis to complete the course. However, our Graduate Program allows students to choose either a master thesis or a research paper, as a requirement to complete the program. The aim of this system is to encourage highly-motivated students in pursuing academic research interests, enhancing career skills, or acquiring a high level of knowledge to obtain a master degree. Major features of this system are as follows:

- Students who choose a master thesis are required to write a thesis with a high academic level, while those choosing a research paper are required to conduct research with a specific theme in their specialized field.
- Students who elect to go on to the Doctor Course from the Master Course are required to write a master thesis. If you are planning to advance to the Doctoral Program, be sure to choose the master thesis.
- A choice between master thesis and research paper must be made at the time you submit your application documentation. Please circle either a master thesis or a research paper on the Application Form. All applicants—regardless whether they are under the category of "Entrance examination" or "Entrance examination designed for the full-fledged"—must make a choice.
- After enrollment, students may change their choice if necessary. However, it requires approval from both the supervisor and sub-supervisor.

Note: Regarding the choice between the master thesis and research paper, **please be sure to seek consultation prior to applying from the faculty member with whom you wish to work**.

- 2. If, due to special circumstances, the Academic Transcript issued by university authorities cannot be submitted, a suitable alternative may be submitted. (A person who has been awarded or is expected to be awarded a bachelor's degree from the National Institute for Academic Degrees and University Evaluation (NIAD-UE) may submit a transcript of scholastic records issued by a junior college, certificate of a degree or certificate of the acceptance of degree application issued by NIAD-UE.)
- 3. Documents 6 and 7: A document prepared in a foreign language other than Japanese or English must be accompanied by a Japanese or English translation.

- 4. Inadequately completed application documents may not be accepted.
- 5. Applicants who have already submitted documents 6 to 8 for preliminary screening do not have to resubmit them.

#### (7) Exemption of Entrance Examination Fee

If you are a resident of Hiroshima City\* and it is determined that it is significantly difficult for you to pay the entrance examination fee, you will be exempt from paying this fee.

If you wish to obtain an exemption of the entrance examination fee, contact the Admissions Office and apply for the exemption by the deadline.

- \* A resident of Hiroshima City refers to a person falling under any of the following:
  - a) An applicant who has had a registered domicile in Hiroshima City since before October 1, 2016; or
  - b) An applicant whose spouse or first-degree family member has had a registered domicile in Hiroshima City since before October 1, 2016.

#### [Deadline] Applications must arrive by 5:00 p.m., June 5 (Mon), 2017.

## (8) Other Important Points for Application

- 1) The university will not accept inadequately completed application documents. Before submitting your documents, be sure to double check them.
- 2) No change can be made to application documents that have been submitted.

#### 3) Submitted application documents and paid examination fees shall not be returned or refunded.

 Once granted, admission may be cancelled if it is determined that contents stated in the submitted documents differ from actual facts.

## 6. Prior Consultation for Those Requiring Consideration for Taking the Exam or Attending Classes

Physically disabled and other applicants who may require consideration for taking the exam or attending classes should complete an application form, which will be provided upon request, and submit it to the Admissions Office.

#### 7. Handling of Private Information

Applicants' personal information contained in submitted application documents, such as name, date of birth and gender, will be used only for the purposes of selection for admission, announcement of results, and enrollment procedures.

## (4) Reduction and Exemption of Admission and Tuition Fees

1) Reduction/Exemption of Admission Fee

Those who find it difficult to pay the admission fee for economic reasons and fall under any of the following may be granted a reduction or exemption of this fee. Please consult the Admissions Office before conducting your enrollment procedures.

- a) The person scheduled to bear the cost of the student's study dies, no more than one year before enrollment;
- b) The student or the person scheduled to bear the cost of study is a victim of a natural disaster, including but not limited to storm and flood damage, no more than one year before enrollment.
- c) The student is a resident of Hiroshima City and belongs to a household that receives public assistance based on the Public Assistance Act.

## 2) Reduction/Exemption of Tuition or Deferral of Payment

Those who find it difficult to pay tuition due to financial hardship and whose academic performance is remarkable may be granted a reduction or exemption of tuition or deferral of payment. Detailed explanation will be given at the orientation meeting to be held after enrollment.
